

Medical Examination/Medical Sport Advice Centre Netherlands Assessment

Some branches of motorsport require a medical assessment.

When does a medical assessment apply?

A medical assessment is compulsory for participants in EC and/or WC championships. From the age of 40, we advise you to have an annual medical assessment.

Why is there a compulsory medical assessment?

The KNMV makes this assessment compulsory because it wants to be sure that it is medically responsible for its riders to take part in motorsport. Additionally, it is important for personal safety during riding, and for your co-riders.

Health insurers often cover the medical assessment

You should have the assessment carried out at a Sport Medisch Adviescentrum (SMA - Medical Sport Advice Centre Netherlands). Alternatively, by one of the KNMV medical examiners. You will find a list of assessment centres on the [licence application page](#). There is often a waiting time, so make sure you make an appointment so that the assessment is completed in time for your licence application. The cost of a medical assessment differs per assessment centre and ranges from € 85 to € 170. Request information about the price at the assessment centre in advance then you will not have any unpleasant surprises. A basic assessment is sufficient.

The assessment centre should use the KNMV assessment form, most centres have these forms in stock but to be completely sure, you can also print the form and take it with you to the assessment. Many health insurers reimburse (a part of the) costs of the medical assessment. You can find all the information about the compensation per insurance on www.sportzorg.nl.
